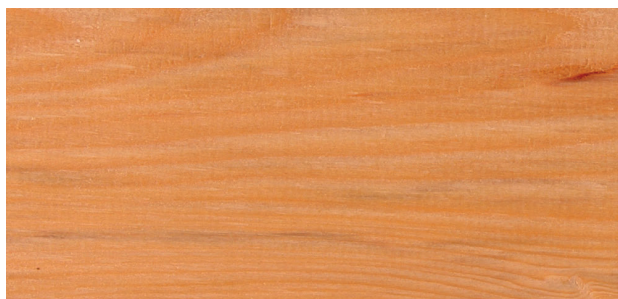

Range Variation

The heartwood has a light reddish-brown hue, while the sapwood is typically only slightly lighter and often blends seamlessly with the heartwood. Occasionally, dark streaks—caused by bark maggots—may be present. Prominent growth rings can create distinctive and attractive grain patterns, especially on flatsawn surfaces.

The wood is generally straight-grained, fairly even in texture, and somewhat lustrous



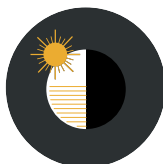
